Sunday school:

Children's ministry grew in new ways this year in our Sunday School classes. We welcomed Brennan Burge and Evelyn Hall to join Kaden Viale as interns for our children's ministry. Each Sunday we saw new and familiar faces, and had the opportunity to learn about God, his love, and our own salvation. Some topics covered this year included: kindness, peace, patience, commitment, the miracles of Jesus, and the joy of sharing the good news of our salvation!





We saw great turnout for our weekly Kids For Christ programing as well! We held 3 multi-week sessions this year, and had the chance to make even deeper connections with so many children who attended. At KFC we had the chance to dive deeper into our bible lessons, play fun games, and create wonderful friendships rooted in faith. Children's ministry wants to give a special thank you to Irene Mason, Karen McPherson and Eliska Thiels for serving dinner to our KFC and JAM attendants, because we all know you create special connections when sharing a meal!

Our annual events went amazingly this year! Our Exploratorium, where we draw connections between God's great world and the scientific knowledge God has blessed us with, saw over 75 child attendees, who had the opportunity to experience science hands-on!





Our Fall Festival saw well over 100 attendees, and brought families from our Gilroy community to GPC!

Both of these events, which help bring new families to our campus, could not have seen the success they did without the amazing help of our wonderful volunteers!

Day Camp

This year Day Camp took on a loud theme of Jammin' with Jesus! Over 2 weeks we had over 100 campers ranging from Preschool aged to incoming 6th graders, 20 Campers in Leadership Training (incoming 7th and 8th graders), 24 counselors (incoming 9th-12th graders), and 4 wonderful assistant directors. We looked into the fruits of the spirit, the trust of Jonah, the bravery of Queen Esther, the forgiveness of Joseph, and the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Camp is such a wonderful ministry because while the children and counselors have a week full of fun, it also is an opportunity for them to meet Christ, and accept him into their hearts.

YOUTH MINISTRY



Our JAM / Middle and Amplify / High School youth groups truly flourished this year, each growing in their walk with Christ. JAM welcomed our new 6th graders (in huge numbers!) and Amplify sadly said goodbye to our 2024 seniors, but eagerly welcomed our 2024 freshmen! Some things we discussed over the last year in both groups were: Bible basics, The

habits of Jesus, Making wise choices, choosing to live out our faith, what does it mean to be a follower of Christ, giving up guilt and shame, and God's forgiveness. In 2024 one thing that really couldn't be denied was our youths' acceptance of Christ as their savior, and their desire to live a Godly life!



Our youth kept busy this year! With trips to the to the boardwalk, Great America, the beach, various backyards, and staying up all night at GPC playing games together they definitely had a fun time! In November we hosted our 8th Annual Hungry Games, with 40 students eating at 3 different houses along the way!

We also attended Mount
Hermon's Fall Frenzy weekend
camps, taking 8 middle school
students, and 14 high schoolers.
This year we dove into what it
means to be rooted in Christ's
love and forgiveness. After
camp, we ended our year with
our annual Christmas party.

ADULTS AND FAMILY

From weekly Bible Studies to Knitting Circles, the LIFT team kept us connected. George Minerva taught a class on the Old Testament, we offered a Women's Self Defense class, learned one another's recipes in our Cooking Class, and enjoyed fellowship provided by the Deacons after church each Sunday.



MISSIONS

This year, the Mission committee was amazed and humbled by our church's generosity! All in all, your donations of over \$32,000 helped to fund the ministries and needs of the following organizations;

St. Joseph's Locally, to support the growing need in our community of those who hungry and homeless, \$7300 to Saint Joseph's Family Center. Additionally, another \$2320 was given to St. Joseph's in memory of Janet Espinosa, one of our long-time members who always fought for and served those in need. This money continues her work in assembling manna/hygiene bags for the unhoused in Gilroy. Lastly, \$4180 was given to the Salvation Army in support of their ministry to the homeless and needy on our community.





Regionally, \$1826 was given to the Immanuel House, our Presbytery operated transition home for refugees in San Jose.

Internationally, \$13,600 was given in care of Odelia Ndze to support a Presbyterian operated Elementary School in Tobin, Cameroon. These funds will help with construction, furnishings and supplies. Additionally, \$1950 was given to support of Autumn Buzzel-Acheapong and the ministry of the City of Refuge (CORM), a school in Ghana that is educating children rescued from forced labor.





Additionally, Sarah Burke, Noella Nfon, and many others helped to stage another successful Walk for Water which saw over 100 walkers participating to raise money for clean water in Africa and beyond.

Lastly, in September, \$2500 was given to send Pastor Trevor, Katie Van Horn, Julie Porras, and Melinda Snavely to Eagle Pass, Texas to plan our next 2025 mission trip, in which our youth will be partaking in in just a few weeks! They will head to Eagle Pass, Texas and Piedras Negras, Mexico to volunteer their time at Receiving Centers for immigrants in Texas, and Receiving Centers and three orphanages in Mexico. Incredibly, our Mission Committee has already given another \$2700 to start off their fundraising in the 2025 year!



FACILITIES

Each year we do repairs to our facilities and this year has been no exception. But, this year, I am excited to celebrate the completion of our \$300,000 Solar and HVAC projects! At this point, we now have reliable



Heating and Air Conditioning in all of our facilities! Also, our Solar System has already



generated over 70,000kWh of energy, enough to offset over 6200 gallons of gasoline! To date, over \$65,000 has been raised to pay for this project, only \$85,000 more to go!

The generosity of the church has been amazing! I look forward to what God has in store for us in 2025!
